Faced with the violence of today's world, the 7th Échelle Humaine festival brings together artists and works that suggest other ways of acting, perceiving, and understanding, on the cusp of the imaginary and the real, of illusion and the tangible.

In partnership with the Festival d'Automne, as part of the Portrait devoted to the work of the Lebanese artists Lina Majdalanie and Rabih Mroué, Lafayette Anticipations presents three striking "nonacademic lectures" by Rabih Mroué, which subvert the principle of the lecture by emulating its mechanisms. Here, he exploits the power of the exercise as a public address, by making a shift that deliberately preserves its ambiguity. The illusion is unsettling, the tone neutral, the expertise seems reliable, the documents produced suggest authenticity: this is the aim of the game, at once mischievous, moving, and ingenious. Also in partnership with the Festival d'Automne, choreographer Dalila Belaza's solo piece *Figures* investigates the possibility of a universal rite, inventing an imaginary traditional dance "without origin or territory" that connects the present to eternity, and the intimate to the history of humanity, with the involvement of a mysterious "material character" charged with ancestral resonances.

On the third floor of the Fondation, another solo performance, *Nox*, conceived to celebrate the night, unfolds in broad daylight. The young dancer and choreographer Léa Vinette summons up the memory of darkness and the stars to rediscover the singular emotional and physical perceptions which they allow. *L'après-midi d'un foehn Version 1* by Compagnie Non Nova - Phia Ménard draws on air and its movements to create a choreography in which our relationship with life and artifice is intertwined and exposed. To close the evenings of Friday and Saturday, choreographer Catol Teixeira's La Peau Entre Les Doigts slips amidst the audience with a fluid, festive energy, in constant metamorphosis. Catol Teixeira is also conceiving and facilitating a workshop with students from the Beaux-Arts de Paris, who will share their work with the audience at the end of the festival. A series of films, collective practices, and public meetings will also round out the programme, opening up further spaces for exchange and immersion, so that the micro-frequencies of life vibrate on every level of the Fondation.

NON-ACADEMIC LECTURES by Rabih Mroué

The idea behind Rabih Mroué's "non-academic lectures" is to hijack the principle of the lecture by imitating its mechanisms, with a performative purpose. The idea is not to mock the principle of the lecture, but rather to exploit the power of the exercise as a public address by making a shift that deliberately preserves its ambiguity, from presentation to representation, from the real to the imaginary. The illusion is unsettling: the tone is neutral, the expertise seems reliable, the supporting documents suggest authenticity: this is the aim of the game, by turns mischievous, moving, and ingenious.

This lecture comes with a disclaimer, *Make Me Stop Smoking* (2006) won't rid you of any addiction. Rather, for the speaker, it is a question of freeing himself from a source of personal cerebral tension—a growing pile of documents accumulated over the years as potential subjects for artistic creations—by unveiling part of it to the public. This heady collection is made up of the memory of contemporary Lebanon, as well as very personal fascinations; a pretext for exploring, between jest and emotion, the process of weaving our intimate or collective memory through the archive.

→ SATURDAY 21 SEPTEMBER at 7pm

In *The Inhabitants of Images* (2008), the pseudolecturer Rabih Mroué indiscriminately combines politics, fiction, and reality by commenting on images. On the one hand, the supposedly impossible meeting between Gamal Abdel Nasser and Rafic Hariri, two deceased political leaders, and on the other, the photos of Hezbollah "martyrs" plastered in the streets of Beirut, provide the speaker with material to develop observations whose implausibility in no way detracts from their relevance. **8pm: public meeting with Rabih Mroué**

→ SUNDAY 22 SEPTEMBER at 11:30am

Sand in the Eyes (2017) delves into the question of the manipulation of opinion inherent to all audiovisual production, as well as in any documented presentation. Using excerpts from propaganda videos produced by the Islamic State organisation as well as official antiterrorist communication from military staff, staged scenes, and military shots taken by drones, the speaker challenges us on the subject of the representation of violence, in particular killing, whatever its sources may be.

In Figures, Dalila Belaza investigates the possibility of a universal rite, inventing an imaginary traditional dance "without origin or territory" that connects the present with eternity. A force that takes possession of the body, echoing a heritage that each of us inherits, often unconsciously.

Developed alongside the group pieces *Au Cœur* and *Rive*, the solo *Figures*, an imaginary ceremony that questions the sources of the contemporary, could both represent the culmination of research as its most pared-down aspect. In a liminal atmosphere, where the intimate is intertwined with the history of humanity, a mysterious "material character" emerges, transcending space and deploying an abstraction charged with ancestral resonance.

As in some of her sister Nacera's creations, in which Dalila has participated since their shared beginnings, the body and dance emerge from the mists of time, from metaphorical narratives to a process of letting go, on the edge of materiality and without ever referring to a specific tradition. Fluid and seemingly abstract, dressed in a costume that seems to have no contours, carried by subliminal lighting and sound environments, this body given over to the unconscious belongs to all the communities of humanity. And, as in the paintings of Pierre Soulages, light can emerge from the darkness, not as an intruder but as its manifestation.

L'APRÈS-MIDI D'UN FOEHN VERSION 1 by Compagnie Non Nova – Phia Ménard

"It was when I was commissioned to create an installation on the theme of 'movement' for the Muséum d'Histoire Naturelle in Nantes in October 2008 that I first had the idea of exploring the element of air and its tremendous imaginary potential. Wandering around the museum alone at night, I spent long hours trying to work out what was troubling me in such a space, surrounded by some of the wildest inanimate mammals. Eventually, I realised that it was the lack of airflow. So I installed a series of silent ventilators in the gallery of evolution. It was through the gentle rustling of fur that I realised I was finally in a place where death is represented. For me, the museum became a graveyard into which I decided to reintroduce life in an unexpected form. A weighted pink plastic bag began to circulate among the frozen animals, like an unruly visitor! This gave rise to the desire to write a choreographic form for transformed plastic bags."

NOX by Léa Vinette

A young woman lives alone in a cold, brilliantly white space where there is no darkness. Both anxious and intrigued by her world, she feels herself disappearing, losing the boundaries of her own identity. The space invites her to transform, challenging the fixed nature of the self and pushing her into a multiplicity of being. A strong sensation of pleasure and power. *Nox* attempts to open doors to perception and introspection. Léa Vinette seeks the power of the body in her work, a primitive sensory body charged with graceful intensity.

Lafayette Anticipations, art for another experience of the world

Created on the initiative of the Galeries Lafayette group, the Fondation is a place of exhibition and sharing dedicated to the visual and performing arts. Located in the heart of Paris in the Marais district, Lafayette Anticipations invites visitors to discover other ways of seeing, feeling, and listening to today's world in order to better imagine, thanks to artists, the world of tomorrow.

Expanding horizons

Each year, the Fondation presents three exhibitions of daring, inspiring, and moving works, offering as many visions of the world as ways of living in it. The emerging music scene is invited to the Closer Music Festival in January, and the performing arts meet the visual arts during the Échelle Humaine festival in September. The public programme reflects, through talks, conversations, and performances, the ideas that shape and shake up our time.

Welcoming

The exhibitions are free of charge and can be viewed alone, in groups, or accompanied by mediators who encourage sharing, for a lively and accessible visit. The Fondation provides events and workshops for young and old alike and opens its doors in order to encourage the expression of all different sensibilities, welcoming the most diverse audiences.

Artists and creation at the heart of the Fondation

The workshops in the basement of the Fondation are a place of experimentation and creation for artists, with custom tools dedicated to production, film editing, and publishing. Each year a new design studio is invited to create visual identities in connection with the exhibitions.

An open space of life

The ground floor and its agora is a space of life that is open to everyone. La Librairie presents the Fondation's publications, books related to the programme and to social issues, as well as design objects and records. At the café-restaurant pluto, the cuisine created by chef Thomas Coupeau is available throughout the day and in the evenings.

A space of solidarity and care

Lafayette Anticipations cultivates a solidarity-based approach to creation: wellness-oriented visits, art therapy programmes, collaborations with partners in the medical-social field, and at-risk populations. The Fondation supports non-profit artistic projects and shares its expertise with young people from all walks of life.

Young generations and the spirit of transmission

Open to young audiences and their families, Lafayette Anticipations is a space for sharing. Texts for children, visits and workshops, festive events and activity books are provided free of charge. In collaboration with education professionals, the Fondation designs activities for visitors ranging from kindergarten to university-level students.

A collection of our times

Lafayette Anticipations continues its support for contemporary creation through its collection and acquisitions supported since 2013 by the Fonds de dotation Famille Moulin. Thanks to a committee of experts, the collection expands each year with works by emerging artists. The fund now includes 370 works which are representative of its commitment.
